They are contained in the Government Bill 1997/98:145, Swedish Environmental Quality Goals An Environmental Policy for a Sustainable Sweden. The Government Bill 2004/05:150,Enviro nmental Quality Objectives - A Shared Responsibility was adopted by the Riksdag in November 2005 and a 16th objective, on biodiversity, was

b) To enhance the developmental effects of labour migration to Sweden, the Government will seek, inter alia through the reform of the Swedish labour immigration policy and within the EU, to further facilitate mobility among labour migrants. We are currently looking at how the positive connections between migration and development can be further facilitated. To that end, Sweden is looking at ways to enable circular migration. There are many definitions of circular migration, but in Sweden the term is used to describe how migrants that have a residence

permit in Sweden, can have the opportunity to return and contribute to development in their country of origin. In order to improve possibilities of circular migration to Sweden, the Swedish Government, in July 2009, appointed an independent Parliamentary Committee to examine the link between circular migration and development. The Committee's task was to map out circular migration and identify factors that influence migrants' opportunities to circulate, i.e. to move from Sweden to their countries of origin and back to Sweden again. The recommendations and proposals of the committee are currently being reviewed within the Government Offices. c) To increase transfer of capital, knowledge and experience by migrants to developing countries, the Government intends to actively engage in and support diaspora groups contribution to development in countries of origin, work for more secure and cheaper remittance transfers (and enhance the development effects of them) and support activities that will encourage entrepreneurship among migrants in Sweden who want to contribute to development in their countries of origin. d) Continue working towards a close international dialogue between countries of destination and countries of origin on ways to strengthen the effects of migration and development.
