- Why was Action Plan developed? 
  — Forest sector is already "green", but how to demonstrate it and make even greater contribution
- First forest and forest sector oriented plan
- Focus on ECE region
- Long term vision practical action
- Participatory approach

### 2. HOW THE ACTION PLAN WAS DEVELOPED?

- 31 replies to a questionnaire circulated via various forest-related mailing lists
- Stakeholder meeting (10-11 May 2011) with representatives from States, NGOs, IGOs...
- A living document to be further developed and refined, in parallel with the review of the Joint ECE/FAO PoW Programme of Work



### 3. GOALS OF THE ACTION PLAN

- Define/demonstrate how the ECE region forest sector can contribute to the green economy – and monitor progress
- Share and promote best practice
- Promote policies which are effective, efficient and equitable
- Communicate achievements to public, policy makers and other sectors

### 3. SCOPE OF THE ACTION PLAN

- « Green Economy » assumed low carbon emission, resource efficient, socially inclusive
- UNECE region
- Forest sector includes forests, industries, consumption, trade of forest products
- NOT a work programme for UNECE/FAO, intended for use by all stakeholders, national and international
