




1. Not perfect shape for Extra Class, but is typical shape for Class I – Class I.




2. Skin defect of less than 1 cm^2 – Class I.




3. Slightly pigmentation due the sun – Class I. In the case that each fruit in one package is showing the same pigmentation then it's class Extra.












