Note by the secretariat

In order to allow SC.1 delegates to have a more concrete picture of the state of overlap between “E” roads and “AH” roads in the Asian Highway network, the UNECE secretariat drew up an inventory which appears in document **TRANS/SC.1/2002/13/Rev.1**.

The secretariat has carried out a revision of that document in order to take into account the latest modifications made to roads which are common to the E and AH networks.
