## PARAGRAPH 5.4.1.1.1 (c)

#### Transmitted by the Government of Germany\*

The secretariat has received from the Central Office for International Carriage by Rail (OCTI) the proposal reproduced below.

#### Justification

According to the third indent of 5.4.1.1.1 (c) applicable as from 1 January 2003, the label model numbers given in Column (5) of Table A in Chapter 3.2 must appear in the transport document for substances and articles of Classes 2, 3, 4.1, 4.2, 5.1, 5.2, 6.1, 6.2, 8 and 9.

In the current version of RID/ADR, however, there are three UN numbers (2211, 3314 and 3359 - an exemption exists for 3373 according to P650) for which no label model is prescribed. This means that no entry is therefore to be made in the transport document. This creates a blank in the system which needs to be filled. It would, however, be advisable in such cases to require the class to be re-entered in the transport document so as to give an approximate idea of the danger of these substances.

#### **Proposed solution**

Add the following text to the end of the third indent of 5.4.1.1.1 (c) of RID/ADR:

"For substances and articles for which no label model is given in Column (5) of Table A in Chapter 3.2, their class according to Column (3a) shall be given instead."
