SECURITY IN THE TRANSPORT OF DANGEROUS GOODS

1. Introduction

It was decided at the RID/ADR Joint Meeting in Bern from 24 to 28 March 2003 to introduce into ADR, RID and ADN a chapter dealing with security in the transport of dangerous goods (report TRANS/WP.15/AC.1/92, para. 82). The core document for the discussion is informal document INF.25 of the March Joint Meeting.

Belgium's substantive remarks and proposals concerning the chapter on security in transport were issued in a parallel document. This document deals only with a drafting problem relating to the French text and a request for further information.

2. Problem of wording concerning sub-section 1.x.2.1

The French text "les activités de formation destinées aux personnes viséesau 1.3.2 doivent aussi comprendre des cours de sensibilisation à la sûreté" gives the impression that 1.3.2 identifies the persons targeted by the training; 1.3.2 in fact deals with training activities. This ambiguity could be obviated by deleting the words "destinées aux personnes". In this case, although the German and English texts are not as ambiguous, they should also be amended.

3. A request for further information concerning paragraph 1.x.33.2.2 (c)

An assessment of security risks is requested in this subparagraph. On what basis should such risks be assessed? Is there an accepted methodology to which this paragraph could refer?
