A. <u>Introduction</u>

Motorcyclists are an established, significant and growing part of the vehicle/driver mix worldwide. Motorcyclist deaths and injuries are a matter of social concern. Motorcyclists are exposed/vulnerable to particular human, vehicle and environmental accident risk factors.

This questionnaire, developed by the small working Group especially created to study improving motorcycle safety, was approved in its principle by the UNECE Working Party on Road Traffic Safety (WP.1) at its 45th session. Its purpose is to collect information on current government activities related to improving motorcycle safety, so that future work can be developed on harmonizing legislation and making best practices available to countries seeking additional ideas.
