TRANSPORT OF DANGEROUS GOODS (ADR) TO THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION Title

Dear Sir,

Finland would like to ask through WP.15 meeting what is the situation in the Russian Federation for transport of dangerous goods by road at the moment.

In Finland we have some problems to transport dangerous goods from Finland to the Russian Federation. Our transport companies have indicated that the transport of dangerous goods requires the special permit when these goods are transported to the Russian Federation. The list of these chemicals is long and it includes e.g. paints (regulation dated 10.10.1999 Moscow). For these permits you have to pay.

We have also understood that the vehicles transporting dangerous goods like paints in packagings are requested to have an ADR-certificate.

Finland would like to see that international transport of dangerous goods could occur according to the ADR-agreement between the countries that have signed the international agreements and that all the problems mentioned above could be removed.
