Chapter 1.4: Obligations of the filler

Transmitted by the International Union of Railways (UIC)*

The secretariat has received from the Central Office for International Carriage by Rail (OCTI) the proposal reproduced below.

SUMMARY

Executive summary:

The definition of "filler" in section 1.2.1 also includes the loading of wagons/vehicles and containers with goods in bulk.

Detailed conditions have been set out in Chapter 7.3 for loading and carriage in bulk.

The obligation of the filler in subsection 1.4.3.3, however, only mention the filling of tanks. For this reason, obligations concerning the filling of means of transport for goods in bulk should be added to this subsection.

Proposal

1.4.3.3 Include a new subparagraph (j) to read:

"(j) he shall, when filling wagons/vehicles, large containers or small containers with goods in bulk, comply with the provisions of Chapter 7.3."

Justification

During discussion of the new Chapter 7.3 at the fortieth session of the RID Committee of Experts, the representative of UIC pointed out that the definition of "filler" in section 1.2.1 also includes the filling of means of transport with goods in bulk, while the filler's obligations in subsection 1.4.3.3 only refer to the filling of tanks.

Since the RID Committee of Experts was nevertheless of the opinion that the problem should be dealt with by the Joint Meeting, UIC now requests the latter to consider the above proposal.

Safety implications

By establishing obligations for the filler of means of transport with goods in bulk, the situation is clarified and safety increased.

Feasibility and enforceability

No problem.
