- 1. **Overtaking** means the action of passing one or more vehicles by moving out into the lane carrying oncoming traffic and subsequently returning to the previously occupied lane.
- 2. <u>Lane change</u> means moving out from the occupied lane while continuing to drive in the original direction.
- 3. <u>Vehicle passing</u> means travelling at a speed greater than the speed of a neighbouring vehicle which is travelling in an adjacent traffic lane.

Note: When Working Party WP.1 comes to draw up proposed amendments to the corresponding articles of the Convention, it is suggested that:

The term "Overtaking" shall be used only in cases where, in order to pass other vehicles travelling ahead of it, a vehicle is obliged to move out into the lane designated for oncoming traffic.

The terms "Lane change" and "Vehicle passing" shall be used when vehicles are travelling on a multilane carriageway for traffic moving in the same direction. In these cases, vehicles shall be forbidden to move out into the lane designated for oncoming traffic, and consequently "Overtaking" shall be prohibited.
