BACKGROUND

At the test engineers meeting in Athens, 2005, the United Kingdom initiated a discussion to establish what interpretation should be made from the ATP Agreement for the duration of validity of a mechanical refrigeration unit test report.

After further discussion at WP.11, 61st meeting in 2005 it was accepted that most refrigeration units would not remain identical in design for longer than six years and suggestions were made to amend Model 10 Test Report to include an expiry date.

At the test engineers meeting in Paris, 2006, the United Kingdom was asked to prepare a formal proposal for WP.11.
