### PROPOSALS FOR AMENDMENTS TO ANNEXES A AND B OF ADR

## Part 8: Pocket lamps

# Transmitted by the Government of Belgium

### Introduction

- 1. Paragraph 8.1.5 (a) stipulates that every transport unit carrying dangerous goods shall be equipped with "a pocket lamp (see also 8.3.4) for each member of the vehicle crew".
- 2. Paragraph 8.3.4 states: "... the lighting apparatus used shall not exhibit any metal surface liable to produce sparks".
- 3. Additional requirement S2 (1) in chapter 8.5 stipulates the use of "Ex"-type lamps for the carriage of flammable substances in a closed vehicle.
- 4. The types of pocket lamp currently authorized by ADR are in fact ranked in order of preference.

## **Proposal**

5. Amend paragraph 8.1.5 (a), fourth indent, as follows: "a pocket lamp **conforming to the provisions of paragraph 8.3.4** for each member of the vehicle crew".

6. Amend paragraph 8.3.4 thus: "The pocket lamps used shall not exhibit any metal surface liable to produce sparks".

## S2 (1) Portable lamps

7. **The cargo area of covered vehicles** carrying liquids having a flash-point of not more than 61° C or flammable substances or articles of Class 2, shall not be entered by persons carrying **pocket lamps** other than portable lamps so designed and constructed that they cannot ignite any flammable vapours or gases which may have penetrated into the interior of the vehicle.

#### Justification

- 8. Two types of pocket lamps are allowed, as per paragraphs 8.3.4 and S2, and thus the objection flagged in paragraph 25 of document TRANS/WP.15/188 is taken into account.
- 9. Any discrepancy between paragraphs 8.1.5 and 8.3.4 is eliminated.
- 10. The basic principle is preserved: If a pocket lamp is used to inspect a load of flammable substances, for safety reasons it is essential that the pocket lamp should be of the "Ex" type.
- 11. Flame lamps are no longer used in the twenty-first century.
- 12. The terminology is based on paragraph 8.1.5 which refers exclusively to "pocket lamp".

## Consequences

- 13. The text is clearer.
- 14. The cost is very low: A pocket lamp conforming to paragraph 8.3.4 costs 5 euros.
