I – Existing legislation:

- Transport of High Consequence Dangerous goods chapter 1.10
 - Road: ADR 2005 Directive 2004/111/EC
 - ▶ Rail: RID 2005 Directive 2004/110/EC
 - Inland waterways: to come

Customs rules on international supply chain security

- ► Implement World Customs Organisation WCO Resolution 2004
- ► Modification of Community Customs Code : Regulation (EC) N° 648/2005
- ► Implementing Rules : Commission Regulation (EC) N° 1875/2006
- ► Relying on "authorised economic operator" approach.

Note: part of worldwide WCO initiative; concerns all operations directly or indirectly linked to import/export; follows customs methodology,



Explosives

- ► Rules on transfer of explosives between Member States (information, procedures) : Decision 2004/388/EC
- ► No additional European Tranport rules beyond TDG (chapter 1.10) rules. National rules exist.
- ► Additional Action Programme to be expected later in 2007: Security Management/security plans/fitting of explosives carrying vehicles with remote monitoring/immobilising/ alarm systems

Note: initiatives in WP 15/ TDG Committee to be expected.



II – Initiatives by European Commission

- Proposal on enhancing supply chain security
 - ► Parallel/linked to WCO initiative with same philosophy
 - ► Internal market/external trade
 - ▶ No progress
- Communication of protection of critical infrastructure
 - ► Key issue of confidentiality
 - ► Key issue of criticality at national/ European level
 - ► Linked to critical infrastructures in energy, water, health etc.
 - ► Difficult to foresee what progress will be made



III – Initiatives by European Industry

Already: "Guidelines" ("Voluntary Code of Conduct")

for application of Art. 1.10 by European

(CEFIC) and national chemical industry

bodies.

Pipeline: ISO/CEN on supply chain security

IV - Others initiatives

- ICAO/IMO: long established. Work should not be duplicated.
- G8/ASEAN+: « International Working Group on Land Transport Security » at present concentrating on passenger transport security. Excellent start. Avoid duplication.
