PROPOSALS OF AMENDMENTS TO THE ATP and ATP HANDBOOK

Report of the informal working group on the ATP questionnaire

Transmitted by the Government of Spain

1. The meeting organized by Spain took place in Las Palmas, Mallorca, on 8 and 9 February 2007 with the participation of the following countries: Denmark, Finland, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia and Spain.

2. The informal working group examined all existing information on the subject and other aspects regarding the questionnaire on the exchange of information on the observance of the ATP.

3. In response to the request made by WP.11 to the informal working group, the present report points out the main work done under the scope of the questionnaire on the exchange of information on the ATP and other aspects that the informal working group examined.

4. The informal working group proposes to include the following new questionnaire in the ATP Handbook in the paragraph referring to Article 6 on measures to ensure the observance of the provisions of the Agreement.

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5. The informal working group also examined other aspects regarding compliance with the ATP and proposed the following two amendments to Annex 1, Appendix 1 for consideration by the Working Party:

Introduce a new paragraph 7 in Annex 1, Appendix 1 that would read as follows:

"7. Administrative checks of the carriage of perishable foodstuffs and transport equipment and their thermal appliances and temperature recorders shall be carried out.

The competent authorities of Contracting Parties may, on their national territory, at any time, conduct spot diagnosis checks to verify whether requirements concerning the carriage of perishable foodstuffs have been met, as well as regarding the manufacture of the transport equipment and their thermal appliances and temperature recorders.

The diagnosis checks may be done by visual inspection of the transport equipment and their thermal appliances and temperature recorders. Such checks may be done independently of the regulated road and railway checks done also by inspection bodies.

Those engaged in the carriage of perishable foodstuffs as well as manufacturers of transport equipment, their thermal appliances and temperature recorders shall, without delay, in the context of their respective obligations, provide competent authorities with the necessary information and documents for carrying out the checks, and shall also make the transport equipment, their thermal appliances and temperature recorders and facilities accessible for the purpose of conducting the checks."

Modify existing paragraph 1 (c) of Annex 1, Appendix 1 by adding a new paragraph, as follows:

"In the case of manufacturer checks, the competent authority (<u>at the level of a single</u> <u>administrative body for each Contracting Party</u>) shall select the units for the determination according to paragraphs 7 to 27 on procedures for measuring the K coefficient.

(In any case, at least one unit from each manufacturer shall be checked annually by the referred method)."
