A. PROPOSAL

Annex 6,

Paragraph 2.1., should be deleted (including the deletion of table 1).

<u>Paragraph 2.2.</u>, renumber as paragraph 2.1 and amend the existing reference to table 2 as reference to table 1.

Paragraph 3., table 3, renumber as table 2 (the note below the table remains unchanged).

Annex 8,

Paragraph 1.3, amend to read:

Colour fastness – The colours of the exposed specimen shall still meet the requirements in **Tables 1 and 2**

B. JUSTIFICATION

This proposal is inline with working document No. ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRE/2007/26 for ECE R No. 104 proposed by GTB. This proposal was discussed and agreed in principle during 57th session. ECE R 69 is also having the daytime colour requirements for retro-reflective markings. As justification given by the GTB under above referred document, the principal objective of retro-reflective markings is to improve conspicuity and recognition of vehicles in darkness and not in daylight. Hence, India feels that day colour requirements should be deleted from the regulation.
