




Russia's Transport & Logistics Market














Russia's Railway Container Transportation Market





Russian Railways Participation in the **Development of Ulan Bator Railway**



Joint stock company Ulan Bator Railway was established in 1949 by the agreement between the Governments of Soviet Union and Mongolia on a parity basis, and currently is the owner of the railway infrastructure in Mongolia

In 2008 Russian Railways (RZD) signed an Agreement to enhance cooperation with JSC Ulan Bator Railway


RZD elaborated "The concept of development of existing railway network of Mongolia and rolling stock modernization", which has been approved by Mongolian side

Main directions of cooperation

- Raising the efficiency of operation of JSC "Ulan-Bator Railway"
- Cooperation in modernization of the existing railway network of Mongolia
- Participation of RZD together with other Russian industries in the mineral deposit projects in Mongolia, including construction of railway lines to those areas


