It is proposed to amend the text proposed in paragraph 4 of document -2009/10 as follows (changes are indicated):

"This page contains links to third-party web sites which are provided as a convenience additional information on GHS. The third-parties in question have informed the United Nations Sub-Committee of Experts on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals that they had developed guidance for the application of the GHS in their own sectors. At its 17th session, the Sub-Committee reiterated its view that the ownership of any sector specific guidance developed by the industry for the application of the GHS criteria belonged to the authors, who should remain responsible for its contents. Most experts suggested that providing a link from the GHS web pages on the UNECE secretariat website to an industry public website containing the guidance would be the best option to make it available worldwide. However, it was made clear that this does would not imply any endorsement of industry's third party's guidance by the Sub-Committee. The third-party remains responsible for the contents of their guidance (see ST/SG/AC.10/C.4/34, paras.37 and 38). The Sub-Committee reminders the user of this webpage that Attention is drawn also to paragraph 1.1.3.1.1 of the GHS, whereby "Ccompetent authorities will decide how to apply the various elements of the GHS based on the needs of the competent authority and the target audience."
