# Introduction

1. The provisions of 8.3.5 state that work requiring the use of an open flame or electric current or liable to cause sparks may be carried out when a certificate attesting to the totally gas-free condition is present. It is unclear what is meant by a "totally gas-free condition".

2. In 7.2.3.7.5 a gas-free condition is described with the purpose of withdrawing dangerous goods markings. This condition supposes a concentration of flammable gases of not more than 20 % of the lower explosive limit or no significant concentration of toxic gases.

3. The proposal aims to modify 8.3.5 in accordance with 7.2.3.7.5.

#### **Proposal**

4. Amend 8.3.5 to read as follows (new text appears in bold):

".....

This requirement does not apply:

when dry cargo vessels are furnished with an authorization from the competent authority or a certificate attesting to **the fact that the protected area does not contain a concentration of flammable gases of more than 20 % of the lower explosive limit or any significant concentration of toxic gases**;

when tank vessels are furnished with an authorization from the competent authority or a certificate attesting to the fact that the vessel does not contain a concentration of flammable gases of more than 20 % of the lower explosive limit or any significant concentration of toxic gases;

....."
