# Auditing of manufacturing facilities of ATP equipment

#### Transmitted by Transfrigoroute International (TI)

#### I. Context

1. Audit reference document for manufacturers of temperature-controlled equipment

Some competent authorities insist on on-site visits to manufacturing facilities of ATP equipment. This may result in numerous visits to factories throughout the year without adding any value to the quality of the products being manufactured when these facilities are already certified to the equivalent of ISO 9001 or better for many years.
