In Skopje 10 communities, NE region (5 communities) and Veles (1 community) and 5 informal settlements in targeted communities

# FINDINGS FROM THE SELF-ASSESSMENT MACEDONIANS DRINK SAFE WATER AND HAVE ACCESS TO SANITATION, BUT...

In every hospital ward there are separate toilets for men and women and bathrooms for personal hygiene, while other health facilities have toilets for men and women, not suitable for maintaining menstrual hygiene



# FINDINGS FROM THE SELF-ASSESSMENT MACEDONIANS DRINK SAFE WATER AND HAVE ACCESS TO SANITATION, BUT

All educational institutions in the city have access to safe water and sanitation.

All educational institutions in the city and countryside have special toilets for men and women as well as in larger schools in the villages, and in some of the smaller satellite schools have common toilets.

But, none of the educational institutions had adequate facilities to maintain menstrual hygiene.


After the result from self-assessment and our campaign we start with readapting school toilets and at the moment we have adapted 12 school toilets and two communities put in their budget toilets adapting with MHM standards





# MACEDONIANS DRINK SAFE WATER AND HAVE ACCESS TO SANITATION, BUT

We have made online teaching for MHM for 2000 students in secondary schools in Skopje, Resen, Kavadarci and Bitola (The children from the Center for Street Children - Suto Orizari, who are street children and live in informal settlements without access to water and sanitation, were also included.



# FINDINGS FROM THE SELF-ASSESSMENT MACEDONIANS DRINK SAFE WATER AND HAVE ACCESS TO SANITATION, BUT...

In Skopje, municipality of **Shuto Orizari** has the **highest** percentage of families living in housing **without water and sanitation**.

The most affected are the women and girls



According to the latest survey by the NGO "InSoC" **95 per cent** of Roma are poor

Only 16 per cent of Roma living in Skopje, mostly in informal settlements, have a toilet and a bathroom in their homes

The rest use toilets outside of their homes. **Just 26** per cent have access to water.

Municipality of Shuto Orizari started project for free of charge connection to the water supply network

# MACEDONIANS DRINK SAFE WATER AND HAVE ACCESS TO SANITATION, BUT

### OBSTACLES TO EQUITABLE ACCESS

Geographical disparities

Lack of finance in the municipalities to develop and maintain the access to water and sanitation

Missing WWTP (except in municipality Kumanovo)

Lack of public toilets (except in Veles)

Lack of MHM in schools (except in one private school in Veles)

Lack of access to drinking water and sanitation for homeless

**Bacteriologically improper** drinking water in rural areas and informal settlements (20-40%)


No access to drinking water and sanitation in religious facilities, temporary camps, informal settlements



### **CHALLENGES**

Setting standards for toilets in public institutions, schools and religious facilities, as well as for public toilets

Before implementation of project in Skopje there weren't any public tailets, after the campaign 4 public toilets in Skopje were opened/adapted and public toilets in Ohrid were built for the first time



### **CHALLENGES II**

Setting up and implementing measures for social protection of the population

**Embrace** services for the **poor informal settlements** as a key utility corporate objective and articulate this within guidelines, strategies and principles in the provision of services to **low income areas**






