Recommendation No. 23 "Freight Cost Code – FCC Harmonization of the Description of Freight Costs and Other Charges" Revision 6*

Note by the Secretariat*

Summary

The fifth session of UN/CEFACT in 1999 approved the recommendation of its Steering Group to delegate the authority for maintenance of the code lists associated with UN/CEFACT Recommendations to the Code Working Group. This authorization was transferred to the Information Content Management Group (ICG) in the reorganization of UN/CEFACT's structure in 2003.

The ICG approved Revision 6¹ of the code list in March 2008 and is submitting these updated lists to the Plenary for information.

I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. 4. The code list is presented with the following columns:

Change indicator (CI)

a plus sign (+) for an addition a hash sign (#) for changes to the code description a letter X (X) for marked for deletion in this edition (will not appear in the next edition).

Group

Level 1 code. 1 digit designation of the main cost heading category.

Subgroup

Level 2 code. 2 digit designation of the general cost description within a cost heading category.

Detail

Level 3 code. 3 digit designation of the detailed cost description within a general cost description.

Description

Cost code description.

Mode/Site Indicator

Character indication of a specific mode of transport or a type of handling site:

- (a) Maritime transport
- (b) Maritime transport deep sea
- (c) Maritime transport feeder service
- (d) Maritime transport ro/ro service
- (e) Maritime transport short sea
- (f) Rail transport
- (g) Road transport
- (h) Air transport
- (i) Mail
- (j) Multimodal/Combined transport
- (k) Fixed transport installations
- (1) Inland water transport
- (m) BB Handling Site: Terminal operation
- (n) DD Handling Site: Ship's agent
- (o) FF Handling Site: Freight forwarder/forwarding agent.

Duplicate Indicator

In order to uniquely identify each code entry in the code list, the following values may be combined to provide the unique key:

- (a) Level 1 Code
- (b) Level 2 Code
- (c) Level 3 Code
- (d) Duplicate Indicator.

- 5. The Duplicate Indicator is a combination of the letter "D" and a sequence number, starting at 1 and incremented by 1 for each subsequent duplicate entry. Duplication occurs when there are multiple entries with identical Level 1, Level 2, and Level 3 code values.
- 6. Reference should be made to the body text of Recommendation No. 23 (ECE/TRADE/170) for further information and examples concerning the structure and utilization of the code list

III. MAINTENANCE AND UPDATING

- 7. Recommendation No. 23 is maintained on behalf of UN/CEFACT by the UN/CEFACT Information Content Management Group (ICG).

UN/CEFACT Heads of Delegation shall be notified of the availability of a draft revision and the period for comment. Following the conclusion of the comment period, the Information Content Management Group (ICG) shall address all comments received. Depending on the comments received, the ICG shall issue a new draft edition for comment or shall prepare a final edition for approval.
- 11. Final revisions to the body text of this Recommendation shall be approved by the UN/CEFACT Plenary and shall be made available on the UN/CEFACT website (http://www.unece.org/cefact).
- 12. Final revisions to the code lists of this Recommendation shall be approved by the Information Content Management Group (ICG) Plenary and notified to the UN/CEFACT Plenary. These revisions shall be made available on the UN/CEFACT website.
