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

Proposal for a Supplement 2 to the 01 Series of Amendments to UN Regulation No. 116 (Anti-theft and alarm systems)

The text reproduced below was prepared by the expert from Germany on behalf of the Workshop on UN Regulations Nos. 155 and 156 to bring the current text of UN Regulation No. 116 in line with the wording that WP.29 voted for at its 191st session to require compliance with the technical requirements of UN Regulation No. 10 in UN Regulation No. 157 (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2023/131). The modifications to the current text of the UN Regulation are marked in bold for new and strikethrough for deleted characters.

I. Proposal

Annex 11, paragraph 5., amend to read:

"5. The effectiveness of the system shall not be adversely affected by cyber-attacks, cyber threats and vulnerabilities. The effectiveness of the security measures shall be demonstrated by empliance with fulfilling the technical requirements of UN Regulation No. 155."

II. Justification

The proposal aims to bring the current text of UN Regulation No. 116 in line with the wording that WP.29 voted for at its 191st session to require compliance with the technical requirements of UN Regulation No. 10 in UN Regulation No. 157 (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2023/131).

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
