
mDL is **NOT** a picture of the physical license on the device





- On 4 December 2023, European Council adopted a position on driving licences
 - Includes a mobile driving licence (mDL)
 - mDL the default mode of issue (within 4 years)
 - Technical interoperability achieved by requiring use of ISO/IEC 18013-5
- On 28 February 2024, EU Parliament approved the following amendments:
 - Have issuers issue both physical and electronic by default; drivers may renounce either format, and issuers shall not "seek to influence them in any way"
 - Have the EU Commission support Member States in pursuing updating the Conventions to accept European mDLs elsewhere







National Digital Credential Harmonization Initiative

"Harmonize mobile driver licences and other credentials across Australia, so that they can be used anywhere and anytime"

- International interoperability test event planned for October 2024
- Will focus on ISO/IEC
 18013 implementations

Relevant mDL features

DOMESTIC DRIVING PERMIT

- Mandatory:
 - Distinguishing sign of issuing country
 - Family name
 - Given name, other names
 - Date and place of birth
 - Date of issue
 - Expiry date
 - Name of the authority which issued the permit
 - Number of the permit
 - Photograph of the holder
 - Signature of the holder
 - Categories of vehicles for which the permit is valid
 - Additional information or limitations for each category
- Optional:
 - Identification number for the purposes of registration
 - Place of normal residence
 - Date of issue for each category (subcategory) of vehicles
 - Expiry date for each category (subcategory) of vehicles
 - Information for purposes of registration in the case of a change in country of normal residence
 - Information for purposes of registration or other information related to road traffic safety

Conventions already supported

Issuer flexibility

Allow issuers to choose what to issue


