As a follow-up of resolution No. 269 “Facilitating the Development of Container Transport on Inland Waterways” of the Inland Transport Committee, the Working Party may wish to begin discussion on establishing the joint management and/or monitoring of AGN and the Protocol on Combined Transport on Inland Waterways to the European Agreement on Important International Combined Transport Lines and Related Installations to ensure alignment between the two legal instruments. SC.3/WP.3 may also wish to continue discussion and provide recommendations for SC.3.

4. Standardization of Technical and Safety Requirements in Inland Navigation

SC.3/WP.3 may wish to take note of information on the application of CEVNI, revision 6, transmitted to the secretariat (ECE/TRANS/SC.3/WP.3/2024/10) and provide guidance to the secretariat for updating the CEVNI status document.

The Working Party may wish to take note of recent amendments to the Police Regulations for the Navigation of the Rhine and the Police Regulations for the Navigation of the Mosel that may be of relevance to CEVNI (ECE/TRANS/SC.3/WP.3/2024/11).

SC.3/WP.3 may wish to continue discussion on aligning the annex to resolution No. 61 with the European Standard laying down Technical Requirements for Inland Navigation vessels (ES-TRIN), edition 2023.
