1. Progress made since 2022

- First targets set in 2014, new targets set in January 2024.
- Process started with an evaluation of existing targets
- Some targets were reached and no longer relevant, others were modified because of experience made and other developments.
- The UNECEs Guidelines on the setting of targets was used in the preparation of the new targets.
- Focus on making progress easier to measure through indicators
- A joint implementation plan set (Min of Health, Min of Environment)
- A permanent "core group" at ministerial level established.
- Stakeholder involvement: Norwegian Water and The Norwegian Association of Local and Regional Authorities
- Process showed greater understanding for the need to set targets than in 2014.

2. Our new 25 targets (down from 50)

	No one should get sick from drinking water
2	Drinking water should not have microbiological abnormalities
}	Drinking water should not have chemical and sensory abnormalities
1	All water bodies with drinking water withdrawals must be protected from contamination
5	Municipal social planning shall ensure that residents have safe drinking water, and drinking water considerations shall be taken into account in land-use planning
6	The municipalities must have comprehensive plans and measures that see water, sewerage and land use in
	context
1	Drinking water supplies must have water treatment adapted to variations in water quality
}	Leakage of drinking water should be reduced
)	The drinking water distribution system should be renewed, not decayed
0	There should be no unforeseen interruptions in the drinking water supply
1	The municipalities' overall risk and vulnerability analyses shall ensure the safety of drinking water supply
2	The municipality's emergency preparedness plans will ensure alternative drinking water
	supplies for all, if necessary through cooperation
3	The population will receive information about the drinking water they receive
4	Water bodies must be in good chemical and ecological condition

3. Our new 25 targets (cont.)

- 15 No one should get sick from swimming in pool facilities outdoors or indoors as a result of the water quality
- 16 Improve access to public toilets

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- 17 No sewage system shall discharge untreated wastewater
- 18 The population in urban settlements shall be connected to the public sewage system
- 19 Larger agglomerations must have sewage systems that at least meet the **EU's requirements for secondary treatment**
- 20 Municipal wastewater must have chemical and/or biological treatment 21
 - Wastewater treatment capacity to follow population growth
 - The sewer network should be renewed, not decayed
 - Emissions from overflow will be reduced
 - Wastewater and stormwater must be separated
