Collaborative platform to support implementation of IRRS, IRIS & IROSS



What's in the Statistical Recommendations?








- Legal framework:
 Grounding the recommendations
- Statistical framework:
 Who to include and how to define different groups
- Statistics, indicators & tabulations:
 What data to collect and statistics to produce
- Data sources:
 How different data sources can be used/improved on
- Coordination:
 How national, regional and international statistical coordination can be capitalized on/improved





Figure 6. Trend of Implementation of Country and Institution Led Examples by

Global Refugee Forum Dec 2023:

- Multi-stakeholder pledge on statistical inclusion of refugees, IDPs and stateless persons (co-led by Djibouti, EGRISS and JDC)
- 99 pledges made including from UNECE and 7 ECE Member States

Momentum built through regional cooperation & experience sharing between countries:

- Observation from engagement LAC & Africa
- Initial efforts to strengthen engagement in Asia and the Pacific & Europe
- Exploring opportunities with UNESCWA in the Middle East

Enhanced linkages to migration statistics
